**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

On June 26, 2020, Tiffany S. Wunsch (claimant/appellant) filed an appeal from the unemployment insurance decision dated June 16, 2020, reference 01. A hearing was scheduled for August 4, 2020. Prior to the hearing being held, the appellant requested the appeal be withdrawn.

**ISSUE:**

Should the request to withdraw the appeal be granted?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

The administrative law judge finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request was made verbally and was recorded.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer to whom the case is assigned. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

**DECISION:**

The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal of the unemployment insurance decision dated June 16, 2020, reference 01, is approved, and that decision shall stand and remain in full force and effect.
