## STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed a representative's December 2, 2013 determination (reference 01) that held her ineligible to receive benefits as of November 3, 2013, because she was not considered unemployed. A hearing was scheduled on January 6, 2014. Mary Eggenburg appeared on the employer's behalf. The claimant was not available when she was called for the hearing. After Eggenburg had been excused, the claimant contacted the Appeals Section. The claimant requested that her appeal be dismissed or withdrawn. Based on the claimant's withdrawal request, the administrative record, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant withdrew her appeal from a representative's December 2, 2013 determination (reference 01). The claimant's January 6, 2014 withdrawal request was recorded.

## **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

871 IAC 26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer to whom the case is assigned. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The claimant's request to withdraw his appeal is approved.

# **DECISION:**

The representative's December 2, 2013 determination (reference 01) is affirmed. The claimant's withdrawal request is approved. This means the claimant remains ineligible to receive benefits as of November 3, 2013, because she is not unemployed.
