STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The claimant filed an appeal of a representative's decision dated November 9, 2009, reference 03. Iowa Workforce Development ("IWD") transferred the case to the Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals on February 22, 2010 to schedule a contested case hearing. A Notice of Telephone Hearing was mailed to all parties on February 23, 2010 scheduling a hearing date of March 10, 2010 at 1:00 p.m. The Notice of Telephone Hearing contained instructions regarding how to participate in the telephone hearing. Neither party called to participate in the hearing. Approximately fifty minutes after the scheduled time for the hearing, Claimant Nadia Merdanovic called and stated she had a

technical problem with the conference call system. I found the hearing should be continued.

A Rescheduled Notice of Telephone Hearing was mailed to all parties on March 11, 2010, scheduling a hearing date of March 31, 2010 at 8:15 a.m. The Rescheduled Notice of Telephone Hearing again contained instructions regarding how to participate in the telephone hearing. Merdanovic called in to participate in the hearing. No representative from IWD called in to participate in the hearing.

The Iowa Administrative Procedure Act provides that if a party fails to appear or participate in a contested case proceeding after proper service of notice, the presiding officer may enter a default decision against the party failing to appear.¹ IWD's rules provide the presiding officer with discretion regarding whether to proceed with a hearing in the absence of one or more of the parties.² IWD received proper notice of the hearing and elected not to participate. A default decision is entered against the IWD.

DECISION

A default decision is entered against Iowa Workforce Development after its failure to appear for the March 31, 2010 hearing. The November 9, 2009 decision under appeal, determining that the claimant was overpaid \$1,141 in unemployment insurance benefits, is REVERSED. The claimant was not overpaid unemployment benefits. Iowa Workforce Development shall take any action necessary to implement this decision.
