Section 96.4-3 – Able to and Available for Work

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Nate S. Thompson (claimant) appealed a representative's December 23, 2004 decision (reference 03) that concluded he was not eligible to receive benefits for the week ending September 18, 2004 because he was on vacation. After a hearing notice was mailed to the claimant's last-known address of record, a telephone hearing was held on January 20, 2005. The claimant participated in the hearing. Based on the evidence, the arguments of the claimant, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

ISSUE:

Is the claimant eligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits for the week ending September 18, 2004?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant established a claim for unemployment insurance benefits during the week of July 11, 2004. He filed a claim for benefits for the week ending September 18, 2004. The claimant left town with friends on September 14, 2004. He returned from his vacation on Saturday or Sunday, September 18 or 19.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Each week a claimant files a claim for unemployment insurance benefits, he must be able to and available for work. Iowa Code §96.4-3. The law presumes a claimant is not able to or available for work when he is out of town for personal reasons for the major portion of the workweek. 871 IAC 24.24(25). The claimant was out of town for about five days during the week ending September 18, 2004. He is not eligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits because he was not available to work while he was on vacation. The claimant is not eligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits during the week ending September 18, 2004.

DECISION:

The representative's December 23, 2004 decision (reference 03) is affirmed. The claimant was not available to work the majority of the week ending September 18, 2004. Therefore, he is not eligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits for this week.
