STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant filed an appeal from the September 29, 2017 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits effective September 24, 2017, because claimant failed to report as directed. After due notice was issued, a telephone hearing was held on October 17, 2017. Claimant participated. The administrative law judge took administrative notice of the claimant's unemployment insurance benefits records including the fact-finding documents.

ISSUES:

Did the claimant fail to report as directed or have good cause for doing so?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony and having examined the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds:

The claimant reported he refused an offer of work when filing his weekly continued claim for the benefit week ending September 16, 2017. He reported this incorrectly as he did not refuse an offer of work and this was simply a reporting error.

A notice was mailed to the claimant to be available for a call from Iowa Workforce Development (IWD) on September 28, 2017. The claimant did receive the notice to be available for the call but his cell phone had been disconnected.

The claimant did not call IWD during the benefit week ending September 30, 2017 to resolve the underlying issue. The following week, on Monday, October 2, 2017, the claimant reported to IWD to attempt to resolve the underlying issue.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant has not established a good cause reason for having failed to report as directed effective September 24, 2017 and benefits are denied through September 30, 2017. However, the claimant reported to the agency the following week to resolve the underlying issue. Benefits are allowed effective October 1, 2017, provided he is otherwise eligible.

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c".

The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.2(1)e provides:

e. In order to maintain continuing eligibility for benefits during any continuous period of unemployment, an individual shall report as directed to do so by an authorized representative of the department. If the individual has moved to another locality, the individual may register and report in person at a workforce development center at the time previously specified for the reporting. The method of reporting shall be weekly if a voice response continued claim is filed, unless otherwise directed by an authorized representative of the department. An individual who files a voice response continued claim will have the benefit payment automatically deposited weekly in the individual's account at a financial institution or be paid by the mailing of a warrant on a biweekly basis. In order for an individual to receive payment by direct deposit, the individual must provide the department with the appropriate bank routing code number and a checking or savings account number. The department retains the ultimate authority to choose the method of reporting and payment.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(11) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(11) Failure to report as directed to workforce development in response to the notice which was mailed to the claimant will result in the claimant being deemed not to meet the availability requirements.

The claimant received the notice of fact-finding interview, but did not have a working cell phone to be contacted at. The claimant did not seek to resolve the underlying issue during the benefit

week ending September 30, 2017. Benefits are denied for the one-week period ending September 30, 2017, due to a failure to report as directed.

An individual's availability for work is determined on a week-by-week basis. The claimant did not report as directed for the benefit week ending September 30, 2017. However, the following week, he did report to IWD in an effort to resolve the issue. Claimant's report in his weekly continued claim that he refused an offer of work was entered in error. Therefore, the claimant is available for work and benefits are allowed effective October 1, 2017, provided he is otherwise eligible.

DECISION:

The September 29, 2017 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision is modified in the claimant's favor. The claimant has not established a good cause reason for failing to report as directed the benefit week ending September 30, 2017 and benefits are denied for the one-week period ending September 30, 2017. The claimant reported to IWD the following week to resolve the issue. Claimant made a reporting error when he reported he refused an offer of work. As such, benefits are allowed effective October 1, 2017, provided he is otherwise eligible.
