STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed a timely appeal from the September 28, 2017, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits because of a failure to report as directed. After due notice was issued, a telephone conference hearing was set for October 23, 2017. Claimant participated.

ISSUE:

Did the claimant fail to report as directed or offer a good cause reason for failure to do so?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony and having examined the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: On September 21, 2017, a notice was mailed to the claimant to be available for a call from IWD on September 27, 2017, at 9:30 a.m. about a report of a work refusal during the week ending September 16, 2017. He did not report because he did not receive the notice.

When making his continued weekly claim, claimant reported refusing an offer of work during the week ending September 16, 2017. That week the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers notified claimant of an employment opportunity with M.J. Electric in Iron Mountain, Minnesota. Claimant stated he was not interested in the position because he was going to be losing his commercial driver's license in November and it was a requirement for the job. No initial investigation or decision has been made regarding whether claimant refused a suitable offer of work.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge finds the claimant has established a good cause reason for having failed to report as directed.

Iowa Code section 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.2(1)e provides:

- e. In order to maintain continuing eligibility for benefits during any continuous period of unemployment, an individual shall report as directed to do so by an authorized representative of the department. If the individual has moved to another locality, the individual may register and report in person at a workforce development center at the time previously specified for the reporting.
- (1) An individual who files a weekly continued claim will have the benefit payment automatically deposited weekly in the individual's account at a financial institution or on a selected debit card.
- (2) In order for an individual to receive payment by direct deposit, the individual must provide the department with the appropriate bank routing code number and a checking or savings account number.
- (3) The department retains the ultimate authority to choose the method of reporting and payment.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(11) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(11) Failure to report as directed to workforce development in response to the notice which was mailed to the claimant will result in the claimant being deemed not to meet the availability requirements.

Since he did not receive the notice, claimant has established a good cause reason for failing to report as directed. However, the matter of whether claimant refused a suitable offer of work must be remanded to the lowa Workforce Development Benefits Bureau for an initial investigation and determination.

DECISION:

The September 28, 2017, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision is reversed. The claimant has established a good cause reason for failing to report as directed. Benefits are allowed effective September 24, 2017, provided he is otherwise eligible.

REMAND:

The issue of whether claimant refused a suitable offer of work as delineated in the findings of fact above is remanded to the Iowa Workforce Development Benefits Bureau for an initial investigation and determination.
