Section 96.4-4 - \$250.00 Earnings Requirement

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Darrel G. Dennis filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated May 11, 2005, reference 01, which denied benefits to him upon a finding that he had not been paid insured wages of at least \$250.00 during or after the previous benefit year in which he had received unemployment insurance benefits. After reviewing the documentation submitted with the appeal letter, the administrative law judge concludes that no additional evidence is necessary. The administrative law judge takes official notice of Agency benefit payment records.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having examined all matters of record, the administrative law judge finds: Darrel G. Dennis received unemployment insurance benefits during a benefit year which began on April 25, 2004. He was paid gross wages of \$1,518.75 from January 1 through April 22, 2005 by NCS Pearson. Federal and state income taxes and Social Security and Medicare taxes were deducted from his earnings. He has opened a new benefit year effective April 24, 2005.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The question is whether Mr. Dennis has met the earnings requirement of Iowa Code section 96.4-4 by earning and being paid insured wages of at least \$250.00 since the beginning of his 2004 benefit year. The claimant has submitted a pay stub establishing that he has. From this the administrative law judge concludes that the requirement of the statute has been met.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated May 11, 2005, reference 01, is reversed. The claimant is entitled to receive unemployment insurance benefits, provided he is otherwise eligible.
