Iowa Code § 96.3(7) – Overpayment of Benefits

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant filed an appeal from the May 12, 2023 (reference 04) unemployment insurance decision that found that the claimant was overpaid unemployment insurance benefits of \$538.00 for two weeks from March 26, 2023 through April 8, 2023. The parties were properly notified of the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on June 5, 2023. The claimant participated personally. Iowa Workforce Development Integrity Bureau did not participate. The administrative law judge took official notice of the claimant's unemployment insurance benefits records. The administrative law judge took official notice of the hearing record established in Appeal 23A-UI-05050-DB-T; 23A-UI-05051-DB-T; and 23A-UI-05052-DB-T.

ISSUE:

Was the claimant overpaid benefits from March 26, 2023 through April 8, 2023?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds:

Claimant filed for unemployment insurance benefits effective January 8, 2023. Between March 26, 2023 and April 8, 2023, the claimant was paid regular unemployment insurance benefits of \$538.00.

Two unemployment insurance decisions were issued on April 21, 2023 (reference 01 and reference 02) which found that the claimant was not eligible for regular unemployment insurance benefits effective April 2, 2023 because she was not able to and available for work. Those decisions were modified in favor of the claimant in Appeal No. 23A-UI-05050-DB-T and 23A-UI-05051-DB-T finding that the claimant was able to and available for work from January 8, 2023 through April 8, 2023. As such, no overpayment of benefits exists.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes as follows:

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides:

7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.


a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

b. (1) (a) If the department determines that an overpayment has been made, the charge for the overpayment against the employer's account shall be removed and the account shall be credited with an amount equal to the overpayment from the unemployment compensation trust fund and this credit shall include both contributory and reimbursable employers, notwithstanding section 96.8, subsection 5.

In this case, the two unemployment insurance benefits decisions that found the claimant was not able to and available for work have been modified in favor of the claimant. See Appeal No. 23A-UI-05050-DB-T and 23A-UI-05051-DB-T. Therefore, because the claimant was able to and available for work from January 8, 2023 through April 8, 2023, she is not overpaid benefits of \$538.00 for the two weeks between March 26, 2023 and April 8, 2023 due to that issue.

DECISION:

The May 12, 2023 (reference 04) unemployment insurance decision is reversed. The claimant is not overpaid \$538.00 for the two weeks between March 26, 2023 and April 8, 2023 due to her not being able to and available for work as that issue has been addressed in Appeal No. 23A-UI-05050-DB-T and 23A-UI-05051-DB-T.

APPEAL RIGHTS. If you disagree with the decision, you or any interested party may:

1. Appeal to the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days of the date under the judge's signature by submitting a written appeal via mail, fax, or online to:

The appeal period will be extended to the next business day if the last day to appeal falls on a weekend or a legal holiday.

AN APPEAL TO THE BOARD SHALL STATE CLEARLY:

- 1) The name, address, and social security number of the claimant.
- 2) A reference to the decision from which the appeal is taken.
- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. Additional information on how to file a petition can be found at Iowa Code §17A.19, which is online at <https://www.legis.iowa.gov/docs/code/17A.19.pdf>.

Note to Parties: YOU MAY REPRESENT yourself in the appeal or obtain a lawyer or other interested party to do so provided there is no expense to Workforce Development. If you wish to be represented by a lawyer, you may obtain the services of either a private attorney or one whose services are paid for with public funds.

Note to Claimant: It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.
