# STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Employer filed an appeal from a decision of a statement of charges dated November 9, 2023, reference 00, which assessed charges for the third quarter of 2023. After due notice, a telephone conference hearing was scheduled for and held on December 21, 2023. Claimant participated personally. Employer participated by Seth Riggan. Claimant failed to respond to the hearing notice and did not participate. Employer's Exhibit 1 was admitted into evidence.

# ISSUES:

Whether the statement of charges is correct.

Whether the statement of charges is timely appealed.

Whether the employer's protest is timely.

# FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having heard the testimony and considered all of the evidence in the record, finds: A statement of charges was mailed to the employer on November 9, 2023. The employer appealed the statement of charges on the basis that the claimant never worked for employer.

This is the second Statement of Charges received by the employer in this matter. The first Statement of Charges was sent on August 9, and received by employer. Although employer did contact uiclaimshelp after receipt of the first Statement of Charges, employer did not file an appeal of that document.

In case 23A-UI-11288-B2-T employer was found to not have timely filed a protest to the Notice of Claim and not to have filed a timely appeal of the August 9, 2023 Statement of Charges.

# **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

lowa Code section 96.6(2) provides, in pertinent part:

The representative shall promptly examine the claim and any protest, take the initiative to ascertain relevant information concerning the claim, and, on the basis of the facts found by the representative, shall determine whether or not the claim is valid, the week with respect to which benefits shall commence, the weekly benefit amount payable and its maximum duration, and whether any disqualification shall be imposed. . . . Unless the claimant or other interested party, after notification or within ten calendar days after notification was mailed to the claimant's last known address, files an appeal from the decision, the decision is final and benefits shall be paid or denied in accordance with the decision.

Iowa Code section 96.7 provides, in relevant part:

Employer contributions and reimbursements.

- 7. Financing benefits paid to employees of governmental entities.
- c. For purposes of this subsection, "governmental reimbursable employer" means an employer which makes payments to the department for the unemployment compensation fund in an amount equivalent to the regular and extended benefits paid, which are based on wages paid for services in the employ of the employer. Benefits paid to an eligible individual shall be charged against the base period employers in the inverse chronological order in which the employment of the individual occurred. However, the amount of benefits charged against an employer for a calendar quarter of the base period shall not exceed the amount of the individual's wage credits based upon employment with that employer during that quarter. At the end of each calendar quarter, the department shall bill each governmental reimbursable employer for benefits paid during that quarter. Payments by a governmental reimbursable employer shall be made in accordance with subsection 8, paragraph "b", subparagraphs (2) through (5).
- 8. Financing benefits paid to employees of nonprofit organizations.

b. Reimbursements for benefits paid in lieu of contributions shall be made in accordance with the following:

(4) The amount due specified in a bill from the department is conclusive unless, not later than fifteen days following the date the bill was mailed or otherwise delivered to the last known address of the nonprofit organization, the nonprofit organization files an application for redetermination with the department setting forth the grounds for the application. The department shall promptly review the amount due specified in the bill and shall issue a redetermination. The redetermination is conclusive on the nonprofit organization unless, not later than thirty days after the redetermination was mailed or otherwise delivered to the last known address of the nonprofit organization, the nonprofit organization files an appeal to the district court pursuant to subsection 5.

(5) The provisions for collection of contributions under section 96.14 are applicable to reimbursements for benefits paid in lieu of contributions.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.4 provides, in relevant part:

- 2. An appeal from an initial decision concerning the allowance or denial of benefits shall be filed, by mail, facsimile, or e-mail, online, or in person, not later than ten calendar days, as determined by the postmark or the date stamp after the decision was mailed to the party at its last-known address and shall state the following:
- a. The name, address and social security number of the claimant;
- b. A reference to the decision from which appeal is taken; and,
- c. The grounds upon which the appeal is based.
- 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of subrule 26.4(2), a contributory employer, which has not previously received a notice of the filing of a valid claim for benefits, may appeal an individual's eligibility to receive benefits within 30 days from the mailing date of the quarterly statement of benefit charges.
- 4. Also notwithstanding the provisions of subrule 26.4(2), a reimbursable employer, which has not previously received a notice of the filing of a valid claim for benefits, may appeal an individual's eligibility to receive benefits within 15 days of the mailing date of the quarterly billing of benefit charges.

Employer's appeal of the notice of contributory charges within 30 days is timely.

Although the appeal is timely, employer previously received a Statement of Charges from IWD on August 9, 2023 and did not timely appeal that claim. Employer's issue – that claimant never worked for employer is the same issue in this matter as existed at the time of the August 9, 2023 Statement of Charges letter sent from IWD. The administrative law judge in 23A-UI-11288-B2-T dismissed that matter, thereby resolving the issue in this matter also.

It is held that the Statement of Charges is correct because employer did not timely dispute the claim that the claimant worked for employer.

# **DECISION:**

The Statement of Charges dated November 9, 2023, reference 00, is affirmed. The Statement of Charges is correct.

# AN APPEAL TO THE BOARD SHALL STATE CLEARLY:

- 1) The name, address, and social security number of the claimant.
- 2) A reference to the decision from which the appeal is taken.
- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. **Note to Claimant:** It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.
