Section 96.3-7 – Recovery of Overpayment of Benefits

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed a June 9, 2006 decision (reference 02) that concluded he had been overpaid \$674.00 in benefits he received for the weeks ending December 30, 2005 through January 21, 2006. The overpayment occurred as the result of a June 8, 2006 monetary redetermination. After a hearing notice was mailed to the claimant's last-known address of record, a telephone hearing was held on July 10, 2006. The claimant participated in the hearing. Based on the evidence, the arguments of the claimant, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

ISSUE:

Has the claimant been overpaid \$674.00 in benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant established a claim for unemployment insurance benefits during the week of December 25, 2005. The claimant filed claims for the weeks ending December 30, 2005, through January 21, 2006. The claimant received a total of \$674.00 in benefits for these weeks.

The claimant appealed a June 8 monetary redetermination that concluded he was not monetarily eligible to receive benefits as of December 25, 2005. This decision has been reversed because the Department did not establish legal authority to issue a monetary redetermination. See decision for appeal 06A-UI-06239-DWT.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

If an individual receives benefits he is not legally entitled to receive, the Department shall recover the benefits even if the individual acted in good faith and is not at fault in receiving the overpayment. Iowa Code § 96.3-7. Based on the decision for appeal 06A-UI-06239-DWT, the claimant is legally entitled to receive a maximum of \$324.00 each week he files a claim for unemployment, if he is otherwise eligible to receive benefits. This means the claimant has not been overpaid \$674.00 in benefits he received for the weeks ending December 30, 2005 through January 21, 2006.

DECISION:

The representative's June 9, 2006 decision (reference 02) is reversed. The claimant is legally entitled to receive benefits for the weeks ending December 30, 2005 through January 21, 2006. The claimant has not been overpaid \$674.00 in benefits he received for these weeks.
