Iowa Code §96.5(1)a - Voluntary Leaving/Other Employment

## STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Claimant filed a timely appeal from the November 17, 2004, reference 01, decision that denied benefits. After due notice was issued, a hearing was held on December 15, 2004. Claimant did participate. Employer did participate through Joyce Poncy.

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant was employed as a full-time deli manager through August 25, 2004 when she quit. The claimant left employment with Elliott Oil to accept other employment at Wal-Mart. They called and hired her on August 25 and she started orientation on August 29. Continued work was available.

#### REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant voluntarily left her employment to accept employment elsewhere.

Iowa Code section 96.5-1-a provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

- 1. Voluntary quitting. If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department. But the individual shall not be disqualified if the department finds that:
- a. The individual left employment in good faith for the sole purpose of accepting other or better employment, which the individual did accept, and the individual performed services in the new employment. Benefits relating to wage credits earned with the employer that the individual has left shall be charged to the unemployment compensation fund. This paragraph applies to both contributory and reimbursable employers, notwithstanding section 96.8, subsection 5.

Even though the separation was without good cause attributable to the employer and would, standing alone, disqualify the claimant from receiving benefits, the claimant did leave in order to accept other employment and did perform services for the subsequent employer. Accordingly, benefits are allowed and the account of the employer shall not be charged.

# **DECISION:**

The November 17, 2004, reference 01, decision is modified in favor of the appellant. The claimant voluntarily left her employment in order to accept other employment. Benefits are allowed, provided the claimant is otherwise eligible. The account of the employer (account number 007058) shall not be charged.
