## STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from the July 7, 2021, (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that concluded she was overpaid \$10,200.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation benefits. After proper notice, a telephone hearing was conducted on September 28, 2021. The hearing was held jointly with Appeal 21A-UI-15614-SN-T. The claimant participated. Official notice of the administrative records was taken.

### ISSUE:

Has the claimant been overpaid any unemployment insurance benefits?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of March 29, 2020.

The claimant received federal unemployment insurance benefits through Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC). The claimant received \$10,200.00 in federal benefits for the period of March 29, 2020 and July 25, 2020. The claimant confirmed she received these payments during the hearing.

The unemployment insurance decision that disqualified the claimant from receiving unemployment insurance benefits has been affirmed in a decision of the administrative law judge in appeal 21A-UI-09153-B2-T.

The claimant's sole argument on appeal is that she qualified for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance on September 25, 2020 for the same period and more. The claimant contends that FPUC payments associated with her PUA award should offset any overpayment regarding FPUC on the initial regular unemployment insurance claim.

There is not anything in the record to support the notion that FPUC payments associated with her PUA claim were used to offset her existing overpayment. In fact, the administrative record

KPYX shows the claimant received an additional \$6,900.00 in FPUC payments which accompanied her PUA benefits.

# REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid FPUC benefits.

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:

7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.

a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

PL116-136, Sec. 2104 provides, in pertinent part:

(b) Provisions of Agreement

(1) Federal pandemic unemployment compensation.--Any agreement under this section shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of regular compensation to individuals in amounts and to the extent that they would be determined if the State law of the State were applied, with respect to any week for which the individual is (disregarding this section) otherwise entitled under the State law to receive regular compensation, as if such State law had been modified in a manner such that the amount of regular compensation (including dependents' allowances) payable for any week shall be equal to

(A) the amount determined under the State law (before the application of this paragraph), plus

(B) an additional amount of \$600 (in this section referred to as "Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation").

. . . .

(f) Fraud and Overpayments

(2) Repayment.--In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency...

Here, the claimant is disqualified from receiving regular unemployment insurance (UI) benefits. Accordingly, this also disqualifies claimant from receiving Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC). The claimant was overpaid \$10,200.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC).

The claimant does not dispute she received this money. Rather the claimant contends the FPUC payments which accompanied her PUA award should offset her existing payment. The administrative record KPYX shows the claimant was issued these FPUC payments as well.

## **DECISION:**

The unemployment insurance decision dated July 7, 2020, (reference 03), is affirmed. The claimant was overpaid \$10,200.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC).
