STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant, Patricia A. Cannaday, filed an appeal from the February 25, 2021 (reference 05) Iowa Workforce Development ("IWD") unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits effective June 7. 2021. The parties were properly notified about the hearing, scheduled for May 14, 2021. Prior to the hearing, claimant submitted a request to withdraw her appeal in writing.

ISSUE:

Should the request to withdraw the appeal be granted?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having considered the evidence in the record, finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request has been submitted in writing.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of an administrative law judge or the manager or chief administrative law judge of the appeals bureau. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is taperecorded by the presiding officer.

An appeal may be dismissed upon the request of a party or in the agency's discretion when the issue or issues on appeal have been resolved in the appellant's favor.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

The hearing for May 14, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. is cancelled.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated February 25, 2021, (reference 05) is affirmed. The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal is approved, and the decision of the representative shall stand and remain in full force and effect.
