Section 96.4-3 – Eligibility for Benefits

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Exide Technologies filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated June 24, 2011, reference 01, that allowed benefits to Chad J. Nadermann upon a finding that he was unemployed due to a short-term layoff. Due notice was issued for a telephone hearing to be held July 25, 2011. The employer did not respond to the hearing notice. The claimant participated on his own behalf.

ISSUE:

Was the claimant on a temporary layoff during the week ending May 28, 2011?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Chad J. Nadermann is a full-time employee of Exide Technologies. During the week ending May 28, 2011, he was laid off for one day. His earnings for the remainder of the week exceeded the sum of his unemployment insurance weekly benefit amount plus \$15.00.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The evidence in this record establishes that the claimant was on a short-term, i.e., one-day, layoff during the week ending May 28, 2011. He filed a claim for the one week. However, his earnings during the remainder of the week were so high that he was not eligible to actually receive unemployment insurance benefits. See Iowa Code section 96.19.38-b.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated June 24, 2011, reference 01, is modified. Although the claimant was on a short-term layoff, his other earnings during the week in question made him ineligible to receive any payment of benefits.
