Section 96.16-4 - Misrepresentation Section 96.3-7 - Recovery of Overpayments

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from an Iowa Workforce Development decision dated August 29, 2007, reference 02, which held that the claimant was overpaid unemployment benefits in the amount of \$131.00, because he incorrectly reported or failed to report wages earned with Custom Steel Erectors for the period from February 11, 2007 to February 17, 2007.

After due notice was issued, a hearing was scheduled for a telephone conference call on

September 24, 2007. The claimant did not participate. Dave Eklund, Investigator/Supervisor, participated for Iowa Workforce Development, Investigation and Recovery.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having heard the testimony of the witness, and having examined all of the evidence in the record, finds: The claimant filed a claim for unemployment benefits with an effective date of July 16, 2006. The claimant claimed for and received unemployment benefits during the first quarter of 2007.

The department audited the claimant's unemployment claim for the first quarter of 2007, and a Custom Steel Erectors representative reported to the department the gross earnings paid to the claimant during for the week ending February 24, 2007. The department compared the employer's wage report against the claimant's claims for the same week.

The claimant reported gross wages of \$342 for the week ending February 24, 2007, and he was paid a benefit of \$131. Based on the employer's wage report, the claimant was not entitled to receive any benefit that made him overpaid \$131.

Investigator Stroud mailed a notice to the claimant regarding the \$131 overpayment, but he failed to respond. The department concluded without any claimant explanation that he misrepresented his claim by substantially under-reporting his wages.

The claimant did not respond to the hearing notice.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue is whether the claimant is overpaid benefits \$131, and if so whether it is the result of misrepresentation.

Iowa Code Section 96.16-4 provides:

4. Misrepresentation. An individual who, by reason of the nondisclosure or misrepresentation by the individual or by another of a material fact, has received any sum as benefits under this chapter while any conditions for the receipt of benefits imposed by this chapter were not fulfilled in the individual's case, or while the individual was disqualified from receiving benefits, shall, in the discretion of the department, either be liable to have the sum deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual under this chapter or shall be liable to repay to the department for the unemployment compensation fund, a sum equal to the amount so received by the individual. If the department seeks to recover the amount of the benefits by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to that amount, the department may file a lien with the county recorder in favor of the state on the individual's property and rights to property, whether real or personal. The amount of the lien shall be collected in a manner similar to the provisions for the collection of past-due contributions in section 96.14, subsection 3.

Iowa Code Section 96.3-7 provides:

7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits. If an individual receives benefits for which

the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The division of job service in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the division a sum equal to the overpayment.

If the division determines that an overpayment has been made, the charge for the overpayment against the employer's account shall be removed and the account shall be credited with an amount equal to the overpayment from the unemployment compensation trust fund and this credit shall include both contributory and reimbursable employers, notwithstanding section 96.8, subsection 5.

The administrative law judge concludes that the claimant is overpaid benefits \$131 for the week ending February 24, 2007 pursuant to lowa Code section 96.16-4. The department established the claimant is overpaid, and he failed to explain why he under-reported his wages.

DECISION:

The decision of the representative dated August 29, 2007, reference 02, is AFFIRMED. The claimant is overpaid benefits \$131 due to misrepresentation.
