**EMPLOYMENT APPEAL BOARD

SECTION: 10A.601 Employment Appeal Board Review

DECISION

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The notice of hearing in this matter was mailed February 10, 2022. The notice set a hearing for February 22, 2022. The Claimant did not appear for or participate in the hearing. The reason the Claimant did not appear is because she is an elderly woman who suffered a fall causing severe back and hip injuries just days prior to the hearing. Her pain medication made it difficult for her to awaken and stay alert. She was unable to participate in the hearing on its scheduled date and time.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Code section 10A.601(4) (2019) provides:

4. Appeal board review. The appeal board may on its own motion affirm, modify, or set aside any decision of an administrative law judge on the basis of the evidence previously submitted in such case, or direct the taking of additional evidence, or may permit any of the parties to such decision to initiate further appeals before it. The appeal board shall permit such further appeal by any of the parties interested in a decision of an administrative law judge and by the representative whose decision has been overruled or modified by the administrative law judge. The appeal board shall review the case pursuant to rules adopted by the appeal board. The appeal board shall promptly notify the interested parties of its findings and decision.

Here the Claimant did not participate in the hearing through no fault of her own. She suffered an unexpected injury that caused her to take pain medication. As a result of this circumstance, she was unable to follow through with her appeal at that time. The Claimant has provided good cause for her nonparticipation. For this reason, the matter will be remanded for another hearing before an administrative law judge so that the Claimant may avail herself of her due process right.

DECISION:

The decision of the administrative law judge dated March 10, 2022 is not vacated and remains in force unless and until the Department makes a differing determination pursuant to this remand. This matter is remanded to an administrative law judge in the Workforce Development Center, Appeals Section. The administrative law judge shall conduct a hearing following due notice. After the hearing, the administrative law judge shall issue a decision which provides the parties appeal rights.
