Section 96.5-1 - Quit

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant, Michael Armbruster, filed an appeal from a decision dated March 4, 2004, reference 01. The decision disqualified him from receiving unemployment benefits. After due notice was issued, a hearing was held by telephone conference call on March 29, 2004. The claimant participated on his own behalf. The employer, Eagle Window and Door (Eagle), participated by Human Resources Representative Amy Turner.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony of the witnesses and having examined all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Michael Armbruster was employed by Eagle from January 2, 2002 until February 3, 2004. He was a full-time laborer.

The claimant was no-call/no-show to work on February 1, 2 and 3, 2004. Mr. Armbruster received the employee handbook which states three days of no-call/no-show to work will be considered a voluntary quit. The claimant acknowledged he was absent from work on those days and did not call in because he felt he was being harassed by one of the team leaders. However, at no time did he go to this person's supervisor, the plant manager or the human resources department to express his concerns and ask that they be addressed.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue is whether the claimant is disqualified. The judge concludes he is.

Iowa Code Section 96.5-1 provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

1. Voluntary quitting. If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department.

871 IAC 24.25(4) provides:

(4) The claimant was absent for three days without giving notice to employer in violation of company rule.

Under the provisions of the above Administrative Code section, three days of no-call/no-show to work is considered a voluntary quit without good cause attributable to the employer. In addition, the claimant's failure to bring his concerns to the attention of the employer prior to quitting, and allowing it an opportunity to address his complaints, also renders this a quit without good cause attributable to the employer under Swanson v. EAB, 554 N.W.2d 294 (Iowa App. 1996). He is disqualified.

DECISION:

The representative's decision of March 4, 2004, reference 01, is affirmed. Michael Armbruster is disqualified, and benefits are withheld until she has earned ten times his weekly benefit amount provided he is otherwise eligible.
