STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant, Lara E. Robinson, filed an appeal from the March 17, 2021 (reference 06) lowa Workforce Development ("IWD") unemployment insurance decision. A telephone hearing was scheduled for June 17, 2021. Prior to the hearing, the claimant/appellant submitted a written request to withdraw the appeal and no hearing was conducted. The request to withdraw the appeal was submitted in writing by M. Leanne Tyler, claimant's attorney.

ISSUE:

Should the request to withdraw the appeal be granted?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having considered the evidence in the record, finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request has been submitted in writing.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of an administrative law judge or the manager or chief administrative law judge of the appeals bureau. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is taperecorded by the presiding officer. An appeal may be dismissed upon the request of a party or in the agency's discretion when the issue or issues on appeal have been resolved in the appellant's favor.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

The hearing scheduled for June 17, 2021 is cancelled.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated March 17, 2021, (reference 06) is affirmed. The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal is approved, and the decision of the representative shall stand and remain in full force and effect.
