NOTICE

A **REHEARING REQUEST** shall state the specific grounds and relief sought. If the rehearing request is denied, a petition may be filed in **DISTRICT COURT** within **30 days** of the date of the denial.

DECISION

**UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS ARE DENIED**

The claimant appealed this case to the Employment Appeal Board. The members of the Employment Appeal Board reviewed the entire record. The Appeal Board finds the administrative law judge's decision is correct. The administrative law judge's Findings of Fact and Reasoning and Conclusions of Law are adopted by the Board as its own. The administrative law judge's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

The Employment Appeal Board would comment that unemployment benefits are paid to eligible claimants who have earned wages from insured work "... as defined in a state employment security law, performed for the a subject employer, or federal employment as defined in the Social Security Act." See, 817 IAC 24.1(62). Thus, wages earned from performing subcontracting work (\$500) are not covered by this definition.
