PL116-136, Sec. 2104(f)(2) – Overpayment of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

On July 7, 2021, Carly Michalec (claimant/appellant) filed an appeal from the June 28, 2021 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that determined she had been overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$9,000.00 based on a disqualification decision.

A telephone hearing was held on August 31, 2021. The parties were properly notified of the hearing. Claimant participated personally. A hearing on claimant's eligibility for unemployment insurance benefits was set at the same date and time. Claimant withdrew her appeal of the decision denying unemployment insurance benefits.

ISSUE:

Was the claimant overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds:

The administrative record shows claimant received FPUC in the amount of \$9,000.00 from the benefit week ending April 18, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending July 25, 2020.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be disqualified from benefits during that period in a decision dated August 21, 2020. That decision remains in force. See 21A-UI-15283-AD-T.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons set forth below, the June 28, 2021 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that determined she had been overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$9,000.00 is AFFIRMED.

PL116-136, Sec. 2104 provides, in pertinent part:

(b) Provisions of Agreement

(1) Federal pandemic unemployment compensation.--Any agreement under this section shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of regular compensation to individuals in amounts and to the extent that they would be determined if the State law of the State were applied, with respect to any week for which the individual is (disregarding this section) otherwise entitled under the State law to receive regular compensation, as if such State law had been modified in a manner such that the amount of regular compensation (including dependents' allowances) payable for any week shall be equal to

(A) the amount determined under the State law (before the application of this paragraph), plus

(B) an additional amount of \$600 (in this section referred to as "Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation").

. . . .

(f) Fraud and Overpayments

(2) Repayment.--In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency, except that the State agency may waive such repayment if it determines that –

- (A) the payment of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation was without fault on the part of any such individual; and
- (B) such repayment would be contrary to equity and good conscience.

The administrative record shows claimant received FPUC in the amount of \$9,000.00 from the benefit week ending April 18, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending July 25, 2020.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be disqualified from benefits during that period in a decision dated August 21, 2020. That decision remains in force. See 21A-UI-15283-AD-T.

Because the claimant is disqualified from receiving regular unemployment insurance (UI) benefits during the above period, she is also ineligible for FPUC during that period. Claimant has therefore been overpaid FPUC in the amount of \$9,000.00.

DECISION:

The June 28, 2021 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that determined she had been overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$9,000.00 is AFFIRMED.
