STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Hy-Vee, Inc. (employer) appealed a representative's March 11, 2005 decision (reference 01) that concluded Edith M. Miller (claimant) was eligible to receive partial unemployment insurance benefits because she was not working as many hours as she had been working for the employer during her base period. A hearing was scheduled for April 7, 2005. Prior to the hearing, the employer made a request to withdraw its appeal. Based on the employer's withdrawal request, the administrative record, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The employer's unemployment insurance representative, TALX, made a written request on March 21, 2005 to withdraw the employer's appeal. The Appeals Section received this request on March 24, 2005.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

871 IAC 26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer to whom the case is assigned. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The employer's request to withdraw its appeal is approved.

DECISION:

The representative's March 11, 2005 decision (reference 01) is affirmed. The employer's withdrawal request is approved. As of January 30, 2005, the claimant is eligible to receive partial unemployment insurance benefits, provided she meets all other eligibility requirements.
