Section 96.4-3 – Able and Available

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Damien Collins (claimant) appealed a representative's February 26, 2004 decision (reference 03) that concluded he was not able to work in his usual occupation as of February 1, 2004. After a hearing notice was mailed to the claimant's last-known address of record, a telephone hearing was held on March 24, 2004. The claimant did participate.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having heard the testimony and considered all of the evidence in the record, finds that: The claimant was restricted from work by his physician from July 28

through September 15, 2003. He was released to work with restrictions on September 15, 2003.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue is whether the claimant was able and available for work. For the following reasons the administrative law judge concludes he is.

871 IAC 24.23(1) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(1) An individual who is ill and presently not able to perform work due to illness.

When an employee is ill and unable to perform work due to that illness he is considered to be unavailable for work. The claimant was not able to work from July 28 through September 15, 2003. He is considered to be unavailable for work from July 28 through September 15, 2003. The claimant is qualified to receive unemployment insurance benefits on February 1, 2004.

DECISION:

The representative's February 26, 2004 decision (reference 03) is reversed. The claimant is qualified to receive unemployment insurance benefits on February 1, 2004.
