STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

On April 10, 2023, the claimant/appellant filed an appeal from the April 5, 2023, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits based on claimant voluntarily quitting on March 9, 2023. The parties were properly notified about the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on May 1, 2023. Claimant participated. Employer did not participate. Claimant's exhibits A, B, and C were admitted into the record.

ISSUES:

Was the separation a layoff, discharge for misconduct, or voluntary quit without good cause?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant began working for employer on May 1, 2015. Claimant last worked as a full-time truck wash manager. Claimant was separated from employment on March 8, 2023.

On March 7, 2023, claimant called his supervisor and informed him he was resigning and gave him two week's notice. Claimant's last day of work was expected to be March 17, 2023.

On March 8, 2023, the claimant and his supervisor got in a disagreement. The supervisor directed to perform work that required claimant to begin shutting down the truck wash. Claimant informed his supervisor he would not be completing the work because he was hired to operate a car wash and not to close it down. Claimant's supervisor became upset because claimant refused to complete the assigned job and discharged claimant. The supervisor asked claimant to turn in his company credit card and leave. Claimant did not have any prior verbal or written warnings.

Claimant filed for benefits with an effective date of March 19, 2023. Claimant did not file a weekly claim until the week ending April 22, 2023.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant voluntarily left the employment without good cause attributable to the employer.

Iowa Code section 96.5(1) provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

1. *Voluntary quitting.* If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.25(38) provides:

Voluntary quit without good cause. In general, a voluntary quit means discontinuing the employment because the employee no longer desires to remain in the relationship of an employee with the employer from whom the employee has separated. The employer has the burden of proving that the claimant is disqualified for benefits pursuant to Iowa Code section 96.5. However, the claimant has the initial burden to produce evidence that the claimant is not disqualified for benefits in cases involving Iowa Code section 96.5, subsection (1), paragraphs "a" through "i," and subsection 10. The following reasons for a voluntary quit shall be presumed to be without good cause attributable to the employer:

(38) Where the claimant gave the employer an advance notice of resignation which caused the employer to discharge the claimant prior to the proposed date of resignation, no disqualification shall be imposed from the last day of work until the proposed date of resignation; however, benefits will be denied effective the proposed date of resignation.

In this case the claimant voluntarily quit his employment on March 7, 2023. Claimant notified the employer his last day of work would be March 17, 2023. Claimant was then discharged by the employer on March 8, 2023. Claimants may be eligible for benefits during the period between their discharge and the date of their resignation. However, claimant did not file a claim for benefits until March 19, 2023, which is after his proposed resignation date. Since claimant voluntarily quit his employment effective March 17, 2023, claimant is not eligible for benefits.

DECISION:

The April 5, 2023, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision is AFFIRMED. The claimant voluntarily left his employment without good cause attributable to the employer. Benefits are withheld until such time as he has worked in and been paid wages for insured work equal to ten times his weekly benefit amount, provided he is otherwise eligible.

- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. If you wish to be represented by a lawyer, you may obtain the services of either a private attorney or one whose services are paid for with public funds.

Note to Claimant: It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.
