## STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Alexson Calahan, the claimant/appellant, filed an appeal from the November 23, 2021, (reference 02) unemployment insurance decision that warned her to make at least two worksearch contacts per week but did not deny benefits. The parties were properly notified of the hearing. A telephone hearing was scheduled for January 24, 2022. No hearing was held as there was sufficient information in Ms. Calahan's appeal letter and one attachment, and the administrative record to resolve the matter without testimony. The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative record.

# ISSUE:

Was the work search warning appropriate?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Ms. Calahan claimed benefits for the week ending November 20, 2021. Ms. Calahan made two work contacts that week. Appeal Attachment A. Ms. Calahan accidentally entered zero instead of two when she submitted her weekly continued claim.

## **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that Ms. Calahan has made an active and earnest search for work.

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(28) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(28) A claimant will be ineligible for benefits because of failure to make an adequate work search after having been previously warned and instructed to expand the search for work effort.

Ms. Calahan has sufficiently demonstrated to the satisfaction of the administrative law judge an active and earnest search for work for the week ending November 20, 2021. Accordingly, the warning was inappropriate.

## **DECISION:**

The November 23, 2021, (reference 02) unemployment insurance decision is reversed. Ms. Calahan did make an active and earnest search for work for the week ending November 20, 2021. Therefore, the warning was inappropriate.
