Section 96.4-3 - Active Work Search

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed an unemployment insurance decision dated March 30, 2004, reference 02, that warned that the claimant had failed to make two in-person job contacts for the week ending March 27, 2004. A telephone hearing was held on April 29, 2004. The claimant participated in the hearing.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of March 7, 2004. At the time the claimant filed for benefits, the claimant was not informed that she had to personally contact two employers each week seeking employment. The claimant believed she could apply for work by resume because she was seeking work in an occupation

in which resumes are the normal way of obtaining employment and she had made resume contacts the last time she applied for unemployment insurance benefits. After receiving the warning from the Agency, she received approval to make resume contacts.

The claimant made two resume job contacts during the week ending March 27, 2004. After the week ended, the claimant filed a weekly claim for benefits using the voice response system. The claimant reported that she had not made two in-person job contacts. Based on that response, the agency issued a warning that the claimant could be disqualified in a future week if she failed to make two in-person job contacts. After receiving the warning from the Agency, she received approval to make resume contacts.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Code Section 96.4-3 provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

871 IAC 24.23(28) provides:

(28) A claimant will be ineligible for benefits because of failure to make an adequate work search after having been previously warned and instructed to expand the search for work effort.

The claimant was not instructed when she applied for unemployment insurance benefits that she was required to make in-person job contacts. The warning was therefore unwarranted.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated March 30, 2004, reference 02, is reversed. The agency shall remove the warning from its records since issuance of the warning was unwarranted.
