Section 96.5-5 - Temporary Disability Benefits

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Claimant appealed a representative's decision dated December 23, 2004, reference 03, that concluded claimant was in eligible for the period August 15, 2004 through October 23, 2004 for unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$2,650.00. A telephone hearing was scheduled and held on January 25, 2005, pursuant to due notice. Claimant did participate. Employer participated by Randy Poole, DDS.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant's employment with employer was separated on October 23, 2003. Claimant received workers'

compensation temporary total disability benefits in the amount of \$351.35 per week during the period August 15, 2004 through October 23, 2004 based upon a work-related injury incurred with the employer.

#### REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that workers' compensation temporary total disability pay was deducted for the correct period. Since it was temporary total disability, it was a wage substitute that should be offset against unemployment benefits. Claimant failed to report the benefits and is thereby disqualified.

Iowa Code Section 96.5-5 provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

5. Other compensation. For any week with respect to which the individual is receiving or has received payment in the form of any of the following:

a. Wages in lieu of notice, separation allowance, severance pay, or dismissal pay.

b. Compensation for temporary disability under the workers' compensation law of any state or under a similar law of the United States.

c. A governmental or other pension, retirement or retired pay, annuity, or any other similar periodic payment made under a plan maintained or contributed to by a base period or chargeable employer where, except for benefits under the federal Social Security Act or the federal Railroad Retirement Act of 1974 or the corresponding provisions of prior law, the plan's eligibility requirements or benefit payments are affected by the base period employment or the remuneration for the base period employment. However, if an individual's benefits are reduced due to the receipt of a payment under this paragraph, the reduction shall be decreased by the same percentage as the percentage contribution of the individual to the plan under which the payment is made.

Provided, that if the remuneration is less than the benefits which would otherwise be due under this chapter, the individual is entitled to receive for the week, if otherwise eligible, benefits reduced by the amount of the remuneration. Provided further, if benefits were paid for any week under this chapter for a period when benefits, remuneration or compensation under paragraph "a", "b", or "c", were paid on a retroactive basis for the same period, or any part thereof, the department shall recover the excess amount of benefits paid by the department for the period, and no employer's account shall be charged with benefits so paid. However, compensation for service-connected disabilities or compensation for accrued leave based on military service, by the beneficiary, with the armed forces of the United States, irrespective of the amount of the benefit, does not disqualify any individual, otherwise qualified, from any of the benefits contemplated herein. A deduction shall not be made from the amount of benefits payable for a week for individuals receiving federal social security pensions to take into account the individuals' contributions to the pension program.

DECISION:

The December 23, 2004, reference 03, decision is affirmed. The workers' compensation temporary total disability was deducted for the correct period. Benefits withheld August 15, 2004 through October 23, 2004.
