## STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant (Ndikumagenge Zacharia) filed an appeal from the January 21, 2021, (reference 06) unemployment insurance decision that concluded he was overpaid \$4,800.00 in FPUC benefits. After proper notice, a telephone hearing was conducted on April 8, 2021. The hearing was held together with Appeal 21A-UI-04403-JC-T. The claimant participated personally and with a Kirundi interpreter from CTS Language Link. Official notice of the administrative records was taken.

## ISSUE:

Is the claimant overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)?

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of March 22, 2020. His weekly benefit amount (WBA) is \$367.00.

The unemployment insurance decision that disqualified the claimant from receiving unemployment insurance benefits has been modified in a decision of the administrative law judge in appeal 20A-UI-09117-JC-T. The administrative law judge concluded claimant may be eligible for benefits for weeks that he was totally or partially unemployed, based upon earnings reported. Claimant earned \$13.00 per hour. Claimant reported \$32.00 in wages each week for the week ending March 28, 2020 and April 4, 2020. Claimant reported \$265.00 for the week ending June 27, 2020. Claimant otherwise reported \$0 in wages.

The claimant received federal unemployment insurance benefits through Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC). Claimant received \$7,800.00 in federal benefits for the period of March 29, 2020 and June 27, 2020.

The employer reported the claimant's actual hours and wages worked as follows:

Claimant does not dispute employer's reporting of hours worked/wages earned.

IWD issued the reference 06 decision dated January 21, 2021, which established an overpayment of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) benefits in the amount of \$4,800.00 for weeks he was not entitled to regular benefits between March 29, 2020 and June 27, 2020.

## **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid FPUC benefits.

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:

- 7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.
- a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

PL116-136, Sec. 2104 provides, in pertinent part:

- (b) Provisions of Agreement
- (1) Federal pandemic unemployment compensation.--Any agreement under this section shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of regular compensation to individuals in amounts and to the extent that they would be determined if the State law of the State were applied, with respect to any week for which the individual is (disregarding this section) otherwise entitled under the State law to receive regular compensation, as if such State law had

been modified in a manner such that the amount of regular compensation (including dependents' allowances) payable for any week shall be equal to

- (A) the amount determined under the State law (before the application of this paragraph), plus
- (B) an additional amount of \$600 (in this section referred to as "Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation").

. . . .

- (f) Fraud and Overpayments
- (2) Repayment.--In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency...

For any week that claimant is not eligible for any regular unemployment insurance benefits, he is also not eligible for FPUC benefits. (See 21A-UI-04403-JC-T for details of claimant's regular overpayment calculations).

As referenced in the chart above, the claimant is disqualified from receiving regular unemployment insurance (UI) benefits for seven weeks he also received FPUC benefits. Accordingly, this also disqualifies claimant from receiving Federal Pandemic Unemployment

Compensation (FPUC). The claimant was overpaid \$4,200.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC).

## **DECISION:**

The unemployment insurance decision dated January 21, 2021, (reference 06), is modified in favor of the claimant/appellant. The claimant was overpaid \$4,200.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC).
