Section 96.5-1 - Voluntary Leaving - Layoff

### STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The employer filed a timely appeal from the March 16, 2005, reference 01, decision that allowed benefits. After due notice was issued, a hearing was held on April 12, 2005. The claimant did not participate. The employer did participate through Rick Miller Owner.

### FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant was employed through March, 2004 when he was laid off as the business changed from having employees to independent contractors. No further work was available for the claimant as an employee of Rick Miller Construction. The claimant continued to work as an independent contractor but did not earn covered wages after March 2004.

# REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant was laid off due to a lack of work.

Iowa Code section 96.5-1 provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

1. Voluntary quitting. If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department.

As of March 2004 the employer no longer offered the claimant work as an employee, he was only offered work as an independent contractor. Therefore, the separation was attributable to a lack of work by the employer. Benefits are allowed, provided the claimant is otherwise eligible.

# **DECISION:**

The March 16, 2005, reference 01, decision is affirmed. The claimant was laid off due to a lack of work. Benefits are allowed, provided the claimant is otherwise eligible.
