### STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

An appeal was filed from an unemployment insurance decision dated January 11, 2019 (reference 01), denying redetermination of the claim based on a business closing. A hearing was scheduled for January 29, 2019. Prior to the hearing being held, the appellant requested the appeal be withdrawn.

# **ISSUE:**

Should the request to withdraw the appeal be granted?

## **FINDINGS OF FACT:**

The administrative law judge finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request was submitted orally and was recorded.

### **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of an administrative law judge or the manager or chief administrative law judge of the appeals bureau. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

## **DECISION:**

The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal of the unemployment insurance decision dated January 11, 2019 (reference 01), is approved, and that decision shall stand and remain in full force and effect.
