Iowa Code § 96.5(1)a – Voluntary Quitting/Other Employment

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Claimant filed an appeal from a decision of a representative dated December 18, 2014, (reference 04) that held claimant ineligible for unemployment insurance benefits. After due notice, an in person hearing was scheduled for and held on February 3, 2015 in Des Moines, Iowa. Claimant participated. Employer participated by Sandeep Kaur, Manager. Claimant's Exhibit 1 was admitted into evidence.

ISSUE:

The issue in this matter is whether claimant quit for good cause attributable to employer.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having heard the testimony and considered all of the evidence in the record, finds: Claimant last worked for employer on November 6, 2014. Claimant was offered a position at Wells Fargo in West Des Moines for better wages and benefits. Claimant put in her two week notice, and informed the hiring agency that she would be available in two weeks. During that time all the positions she was available and qualified for were filled, and claimant was not able to begin work there at that time. Continued work was available when claimant submitted her resignation to employer.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant voluntarily left the employment to accept employment elsewhere.

Iowa Code § 96.5-1-a provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits:

1. Voluntary quitting. If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department. But the individual shall not be disqualified if the department finds that:

a. The individual left employment in good faith for the sole purpose of accepting other or better employment, which the individual did accept, and the individual performed services in the new employment. Benefits relating to wage credits earned with the employer that the individual has left shall be charged to the unemployment compensation fund. This paragraph applies to both contributory and reimbursable employers, notwithstanding section 96.8, subsection 5.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.28(5) provides:

Voluntary quit requalifications and previously adjudicated voluntary quit issues.

(5) The claimant shall be eligible for benefits even though the claimant voluntarily quit if the claimant left for the sole purpose of accepting an offer of other or better employment, which the claimant did accept, and from which the claimant is separated, before or after having started the new employment. The employment does not have to be covered employment and does not include self-employment.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-23.43(5) provides:

(5) Sole purpose. The claimant shall be eligible for benefits even though the claimant voluntarily quit if the claimant left for the sole purpose of accepting an offer of other or better employment, which the claimant did accept, and from which the claimant is separated, before or after having started the new employment. No charge shall accrue to the account of the former voluntarily quit employer.

Even though the separation was without good cause attributable to the employer and would, standing alone, disqualify the claimant from receiving benefits, the claimant did leave in order to accept other employment at Wells Fargo, but was separated before having started the new employment. Accordingly, benefits are allowed and the account of the employer shall not be charged.

DECISION:

The December 18, 2014, (reference 04) decision is modified in favor of the appellant. The claimant voluntarily left the employment in order to accept other employment. Benefits are allowed, provided the claimant is otherwise eligible. The account of the employer (account number 536263-000) shall not be charged.
