**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

Greg E. Hanson filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated December 5, 2011, reference 07, that denied his request for training extension benefits. After due notice was issued, a telephone hearing was held December 23, 2011 with Mr. Hanson participating.

**ISSUE:**

Is the claimant eligible for training extension benefits?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Greg E. Hanson filed a claim for unemployment insurance benefits effective October 17, 2010 after being laid off from part-time employment with Carol Wellman. He has exhausted his state unemployment insurance benefits as well as the federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits based on that claim.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

The question is whether Mr. Hanson, having exhausted regular state unemployment insurance benefits and federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits, is now eligible for training extension benefits. He is not.

The training extension benefits program is established in Iowa Code § 96.3-5-b. Eligibility requirements are found in the statute as well as Iowa Administrative Code section 871-24.40. Not all individuals who are eligible for regular unemployment insurance benefits and federal extended benefits are also eligible for training extension benefits. This program is limited to individuals who have become unemployed under certain specific circumstances from full-time employment. Mr. Hanson is not eligible for this program because his underlying employment was part time.

**DECISION:**

The unemployment insurance decision dated December 5, 2011, reference 07, is affirmed. The claimant is not eligible for training extension benefits.
