# DECISION

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

The notice of hearing in this matter was mailed September 10, 2007. The notice set a hearing for September 24, 2007. The claimant did not appear for or participate in the hearing. The claimant contacted the agency to provide a telephone at which he could be reached for the hearing. The reason the claimant did not appear is because the administrative law judge did not call the number provided. Five minutes after the hearing time for case 08503 (the overpayment issue) the claimant called the administrative law judge was not available.

## REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Code section 10A.601(4) (2007) provides:

5. Appeal board review. The appeal board may on its own motion affirm, modify, or set aside any decision of a administrative law judge on the basis of the evidence previously submitted in such case, or direct the taking of additional evidence, or may permit any of the parties to such decision to initiate further appeals before it. The appeal board shall permit such further appeal by any of the parties interested in a decision of an administrative law judge. The appeal board shall review the case pursuant to rules adopted by the appeal board. The appeal board shall promptly notify the interested parties of its findings and decision.

Here the claimant did not participate in the hearing through no fault of the claimant. The claimant contacted the agency to provide a number for the administrative law judge to call, but never received the

call to participate. For this reason, the matter will be remanded for another hearing before an administrative law judge.

#### DECISION:

The decision of the administrative law judge dated September 27, 2007 is not vacated. This matter is remanded to an administrative law judge in the Workforce Development Center, Appeals Section. The administrative law judge shall conduct a hearing following due notice. After the hearing, the administrative law judge shall issue a decision, which provides the parties appeal rights.
