**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

The claimant/appellant filed an appeal from the November 23, 2022 (reference 02) unemployment insurance decision that found claimant was ineligible for unemployment benefits because he was still employed for the same hours and wages as in her original contract of hire. The parties were properly notified of the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on December 22, 2022. The claimant, Laron Thurmond, participated. The employer, Retail Services Wis Corporation, did not participate. The administrative law judge took administrative notice of the claimant's unemployment insurance benefits file including the fact-finding documents.

**ISSUES:**

Is the claimant able to work and available for work effective October 30, 2022?  
Is claimant employed for the same hours and wages?  
Is claimant totally, partially or temporarily unemployed?  
Can the employer's account be charged?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant worked as a part-time inventory specialist with varied hours beginning April 19, 2022. When the claimant was hired, he was not guaranteed a minimum number of hours per week. The claimant's hours were reduced beginning October 30, 2022 due to a lack of work. When claimant was hired, he understood that his hours may be reduced at times.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes as follows:

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", subparagraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3, are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(26) provides:


Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(26) Where a claimant is still employed in a part-time job at the same hours and wages as contemplated in the original contract for hire and is not working on a reduced workweek basis different from the contract for hire, such claimant cannot be considered partially unemployed.

The claimant is still employed in his part-time job at the same hours and wages as contemplated in the original contract for hire. While claimant's hours may have been reduced for a period, this was not different from what he understood his work to be in the original contract for hire.

**DECISION:**

The November 23, 2022 (reference 02) decision is affirmed. Claimant is still employed in his part-time job at the same hours and same wages as in his original contract of hire and is therefore not partial unemployed.

The appeal period will be extended to the next business day if the last day to appeal falls on a weekend or a legal holiday.

**AN APPEAL TO THE BOARD SHALL STATE CLEARLY:**

- 1) The name, address, and social security number of the claimant.
- 2) A reference to the decision from which the appeal is taken.
- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. If you wish to be represented by a lawyer, you may obtain the services of either a private attorney or one whose services are paid for with public funds.

**Note to Claimant:** It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.
