STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

On September 12, 2022, Iowa Western Community College (employer/appellant) filed an appeal from the August 31, 2022, reference 01, unemployment insurance decision that allowed benefits based on a finding that the claimant completed her contract for hire. . A telephone hearing was held at on October 10, 2022 pursuant to due notice. The claimant, Erica Heller, participated and testified. The employer appeared through witness Robyn Porter, Direct of Human Resources. Claimant's Exhibit A was admitted. Employer's Exhibit 1 was admitted. The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative record.

Nunc Pro Tunc:

In the "DECISION" section of the original Decision the word "reversed" in the first sentence is changed to "affirmed".

ISSUE:

Whether claimant's separation was a voluntary quit without good cause attributable to employer.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant began working for employer on August 9, 2021.. Claimant last worked as a full-time faculty member under an annual employment contract in the Speech department for Iowa Western Community College.. Claimant was separated from employment on May 16, 2022, when the College informed her that her contract for the 2022/2023 school year would not be renewed. The claimant's last day of work was May 16, 2022.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that the claimant was separated from employment for no disqualifying reason. Benefits are allowed.

Iowa Code section 96.5(1) provides:

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits, regardless of the source of the individual's wage credits:

1. Voluntary quitting. If the individual has left work voluntarily without good cause attributable to the individual's employer, if so found by the department.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.26(22) provides:

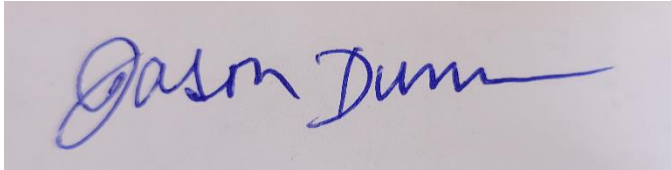
Voluntary quit with good cause attributable to the employer and separations not considered to be voluntary quits. The following are reasons for a claimant leaving employment with good cause attributable to the employer:

(22) The claimant was hired for a specific period of time and completed the contract of hire by working until this specific period of time had lapsed. However, this subrule shall not apply to substitute school employees who are subject to the provisions of Iowa Code section 96.4(5) which denies benefits that are based on service in an educational institution when the individual declines or refuses to accept a new contract or reasonable assurance of continued employment status. Under this circumstance, the substitute school employees shall be considered to have voluntarily quit employment.

The claimant completed her contract for hire on May 16 2022. Her employer informed her that her contract would not be renewed for the upcoming school year. Claimant's separation was not due to any misconduct. Benefits are allowed.

DECISION:

The August 31, 2022, reference 01, unemployment insurance decision is AFFIRMED. Claimant was separated from employment for no disqualifying reason and benefits are allowed provided she is otherwise eligible.

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APPEAL RIGHTS. If you disagree with the decision, you or any interested party may:

1. Appeal to the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days of the date under the judge's signature by submitting a written appeal via mail, fax, or online to:

The appeal period will be extended to the next business day if the last day to appeal falls on a weekend or a legal holiday.

AN APPEAL TO THE BOARD SHALL STATE CLEARLY:

- 1) The name, address, and social security number of the claimant.
- 2) A reference to the decision from which the appeal is taken.
- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. Note to Parties: YOU MAY REPRESENT yourself in the appeal or obtain a lawyer or other interested party to do so provided there is no expense to Workforce Development. If you wish to be represented by a lawyer, you may obtain the services of either a private attorney or one whose services are paid for with public funds.

Note to Claimant: It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.

2. Si nadie presenta una apelación de la decisión del juez ante la Junta de Apelaciones Laborales dentro de los quince (15) días, la decisión se convierte en acción final de la agencia y usted tiene la opción de presentar una petición de revisión judicial en el Tribunal de Distrito dentro de los treinta (30) días después de que la decisión adquiriera firmeza.
