PL116-136, Sec. 2104 – Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) Iowa Code § 96.3(7) – Recovery of Benefit Overpayment

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant filed an appeal from the September 30, 2021 (reference 03) unemployment insurance decision that established an overpayment of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) benefits. The claimant was properly notified of the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on December 6, 2021. The hearing was held together with Appeals 21A-UI-22580-JC-T and 21A-UI-22582-JC-T. The administrative law judge took administrative notice of the claimant's unemployment insurance benefits records. Department Exhibit 1 was admitted.

ISSUE:

Is the claimant overpaid FPUC benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony and considered all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant filed an initial claim for regular unemployment insurance benefits funded by the State of Iowa with an effective date of August 23, 2020. Claimant received \$1,800.00 in FPUC benefits for the period between April 4, 2021 and June 5, 2021. The initial decision denying benefits effective April 4, 2021 has been affirmed in Appeal 21A-UI-22580-JC-T.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid FPUC benefits.

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:

7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.

a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault,

the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

PL116-136, Sec. 2104 provides, in pertinent part:

(b) Provisions of Agreement

(1) Federal pandemic unemployment compensation.--Any agreement under this section shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of regular compensation to individuals in amounts and to the extent that they would be determined if the State law of the State were applied, with respect to any week for which the individual is (disregarding this section) otherwise entitled under the State law to receive regular compensation, as if such State law had been modified in a manner such that the amount of regular compensation (including dependents' allowances) payable for any week shall be equal to

(A) the amount determined under the State law (before the application of this paragraph), plus

(B) an additional amount of \$600.00 (in this section referred to as "Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation").

....

(f) Fraud and Overpayments

(2) Repayment.--In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency...

Since the decision disqualifying the claimant has been affirmed, the claimant was overpaid \$1,800.00 in FPUC benefits.

This decision determines you have been overpaid FPUC under the CARES Act. Additionally, instructions for requesting a waiver of this overpayment can be found at https://www.iowaworkforcedevelopment.gov/unemployment-insurance-overpayment-and-recovery. If this decision becomes final and you are not eligible for a waiver, you will have to repay the benefits you received.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated September 30, 2021, (reference 0), is AFFIRMED. The claimant was overpaid \$1,800.00 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) benefits.
