481 Iowa Administrative Code 10.24(1) – Proposed Decision Dismissing Appeal

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On July 28, 2014, Jonathan Linnenbrink, investigator with Iowa Workforce Development (IWD), contacted the administrative law judge and reported that after speaking to Maria E. King regarding the “appeal letter” filed on July 2, 2014, King stated that she had not typed the appeal letter nor had she intended to appeal the action of IWD establishing and requesting repayment of a claim for an alleged overpayment of unemployment benefits (UIB). On July 28, 2014, the judge spoke with King and she

confirmed that she had not typed the appeal letter nor had she intended to appeal the action of IWD establishing and requesting repayment of the claim.

Since there is no issue left to resolve between the parties, it is ORDERED that the appeal be dismissed and the appeal hearing scheduled for August 14, 2014 be canceled.

DECISION

It is ORDERED that the appeal be dismissed.
