## DECISION

## UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS ARE DENIED

The Claimant appealed this case to the Employment Appeal Board. The members of the Employment Appeal Board, one member concurring, reviewed the entire record. The Appeal Board finds the administrative law judge's decision is correct. The administrative law judge's Findings of Fact and Reasoning and Conclusions of Law are adopted by the Board as its own. The administrative law judge's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

The majority of the Board members would comment that although the Claimant is not eligible for benefits while she is away tending to a sick relative, she may requalify after she becomes able and available and has returned to the Employer to offer her services in accordance with Iowa Code section 96.5(1)"c" as follows:

The individual left employment for the necessary and sole purpose of taking care of a member of the individual's immediate family who was then injured or

	ill, and if after said member of the family sufficiently recovered, the individual immediately returned to and offered the individual's services to the individual's employer, provided, however, that during such period the individual did not accept any other employment.
