Section 871IAC26.8(1) - Withdrawal of Appeal

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

An appeal was filed from an unemployment insurance decision dated February 18, 2004, reference 01. A hearing was scheduled for May 13, 2004. Prior to the hearing being held, the appealant requested the appeal be withdrawn.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

871 IAC 26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer to whom the case is assigned. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated February 18, 2004, reference 01, is affirmed. The decision denying benefits remains in effect.
