STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

On November 14, 2023, Advance Services Inc. (employer) filed an appeal from the statement of charges dated November 9, 2023, reference 07, for the third quarter of 2023. A hearing was scheduled for 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, pursuant to due notice. However, the administrative record contained sufficient information to render a decision without taking additional testimony. No hearing was held.

ISSUES:

Was the employer's protest timely? Was the employer's appeal from the statement of charges timely?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant separated from employment on July 21, 2023 and she filed a claim for benefits effective September 10, 2023. The notice of claim was provided to the employer through the online SIDES system with an email alert sent on September 16, 2023. The employer filed its protest through the online SIDES system on September 27, 2023.

On October 6, 2023, Iowa Workforce Development ("IWD") issued the reference 03 decision determining claimant was denied benefits based on her separation from temporary employment. Claimant appealed that decision on October 12, 2023. After a hearing, an administrative law judge affirmed the decision denying benefits because claimant defaulted by failing to appear for the hearing. See 23A-UI-09773-ED-T. Next, IWD issued the November 3, 2023 (reference 06) decision finding claimant was overpaid benefits based on the reference 03 denial. Claimant has not appealed that decision.

The employer next received the November 9, 2023 (reference 07) statement of charges for the third quarter of 2023. It filed an appeal on November 14, 2023.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the employer did file a timely appeal to the statement of charges.

Iowa Code section 96.6(2) provides, in pertinent part:

Filing – determination – appeal.

2. Initial determination. A representative designated by the director shall promptly notify all interested parties to the claim of its filing, and the parties have ten days from the date of mailing the notice of the filing of the claim by ordinary mail to the last known address to protest payment of benefits to the claimant.

Iowa Code section 96.7(2)a(6) provides:

Employer contribution and reimbursements.

- 2. Contribution rates based on benefit experience.
- a. (6) Within forty days after the close of each calendar quarter, the department shall notify each employer of the amount of benefits charged to the employer's account during that quarter. The notification shall show the name of each individual to whom benefits were paid, the individual's social security number, and the amount of benefits paid to the individual. An employer which has not been notified as provided in section 96.6, subsection 2, of the allowance of benefits to an individual, may within thirty days after the date of mailing of the notification appeal to the department for a hearing to determine the eligibility of the individual to receive benefits. The appeal shall be referred to an administrative law judge for hearing and the employer and the individual shall receive notice of the time and place of the hearing.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.4 provides, in relevant part:

- 2. An appeal from an initial decision concerning the allowance or denial of benefits shall be filed, by mail, facsimile, or e-mail, online, or in person, not later than ten calendar days, as determined by the postmark or the date stamp after the decision was mailed to the party at its last-known address and shall state the following:
- a. The name, address and social security number of the claimant;
- b. A reference to the decision from which appeal is taken; and,
- c. The grounds upon which the appeal is based.
- 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of subrule 26.4(2), a contributory employer, which has not previously received a notice of the filing of a valid claim for benefits, may appeal an individual's eligibility to receive benefits within 30 days from the mailing date of the guarterly statement of benefit charges.
- 4. Also notwithstanding the provisions of subrule 26.4(2), a reimbursable employer, which has not previously received a notice of the filing of a valid claim

for benefits, may appeal an individual's eligibility to receive benefits within 15 days of the mailing date of the quarterly billing of benefit charges.

The employer has actively participated in each step of the process, by responding to the notice of claim with a protest and by responding to both the second quarter 2023 and the third quarter 2023 statement of charges with appeals. This most recent appeal is both timely and appropriate.

At this point, the claimant's separation has been adjudicated and the agency has issued claimant an overpayment decision in connection with that separation. This matter is remanded to the Tax Bureau of Iowa Workforce Development to ensure the appropriate credit is placed on the employer's account, reversing the charges.

DECISION:

The November 9, 2023, reference 07, statement of charges for the third quarter of 2023 is affirmed, pending the outcome of the remanded issue. The employer has filed a timely appeal from that statement of charges, as the notice of claim was not received.

REMAND: This matter is remanded to the Tax Bureau to ensure the appropriate credit is placed on the employer's account, reversing the charges related to claimant's receipt of benefits charged to this employer.

1. Appeal to the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days of the date under the judge's signature by submitting a written appeal via mail, fax, or online to:

AN APPEAL TO THE BOARD SHALL STATE CLEARLY:

- 1) The name, address, and social security number of the claimant.
- 2) A reference to the decision from which the appeal is taken.
- 3) That an appeal from such decision is being made and such appeal is signed.
- 4) The grounds upon which such appeal is based.

An Employment Appeal Board decision is final agency action. If a party disagrees with the Employment Appeal Board decision, they may then file a petition for judicial review in district court.

2. If no one files an appeal of the judge's decision with the Employment Appeal Board within fifteen (15) days, the decision becomes final agency action, and you have the option to file a petition for judicial review in District Court within thirty (30) days after the decision becomes final. Additional information on how to file a petition can be found at Iowa Code §17A.19, which is online at https://www.legis.iowa.gov/docs/code/17A.19.pdf or by contacting the District Court Clerk of Court https://www.iowacourts.gov/iowa-courts/court-directory/.

Note to Parties: YOU MAY REPRESENT yourself in the appeal or obtain a lawyer or other interested party to do so provided there is no expense to Workforce Development. If you wish to be represented by a lawyer, you may obtain the services of either a private attorney or one whose services are paid for with public funds.

Note to Claimant: It is important that you file your weekly claim as directed, while this appeal is pending, to protect your continuing right to benefits.
