Section 96.4-3 - Able and Available for Work

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

James Blair (claimant) appealed an unemployment insurance decision dated November 18, 2004, reference 02, which held that he was not eligible for unemployment insurance benefits because he is still employed at the same hours and wages as in his original contract of hire with Southeast Iowa Regional Planning (employer). After hearing notices were mailed to the parties' last-known addresses of record, a telephone hearing was held on December 22, 2004. The claimant participated in the hearing. The employer participated through Brian Tapp, Executive Director.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having heard the testimony and considered all of the evidence in the record, finds that: The claimant was hired as a part-time transit bus driver with Southeast lowa Regional Planning in July 1, 2004 and continues to be employed in that same capacity with no change in his hours or wages. He went on a personal leave of absence on November 6, 2004 and has not yet returned to work.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue to be determined is whether the claimant is still employed with the employer for the same hours and wages as contemplated in the original contract of hire.

Iowa Code Section 96.4-3 provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

871 IAC 24.23(26) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(26) Where a claimant is still employed in a part-time job at the same hours and wages as contemplated in the original contract for hire and is not working on a reduced workweek basis different from the contract for hire, such claimant cannot be considered partially unemployed.

The claimant was hired as a part-time transit driver. He is currently on a personal leave of absence. He continues to be an employee for this employer at the same hours and wages as contemplated in his original contract of hire, but is merely on a temporary leave. The claimant does not meet the availability requirements of the law and therefore, benefits are denied.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated November 18, 2004, reference 02, is affirmed. The claimant does not meet the availability requirements of the law and is therefore disqualified from receiving benefits.
