STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from the September 8, 2021, (reference 05) unemployment insurance decision that concluded she was overpaid \$5,328.00 in PEUC unemployment insurance benefits. After proper notice, a telephone hearing was conducted on November 12, 2021. The hearing was held together with appeals 21A-UI-20766-JD-, 21A-UI-20767-JD-T, 21A-UI-20770-JD-T, 21A-UI-20771-JD-T, 21A-UI-20772-JD-T The claimant, Maria Gomez Reynolds, participated and testified. Official notice of the administrative records was taken.

ISSUES:

Is the claimant overpaid Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of March 15, 2020.

The claimant received federal unemployment insurance benefits through Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC). Claimant received \$5,328.00.00 in federal benefits for the 8-week period between July 12, 2020, through March 13, 2021.

The unemployment insurance decision that disqualified the claimant from receiving unemployment insurance benefits has been affirmed in a decision of the administrative law judge in appeal 21A-UI-13749-CS-T.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid PEUC benefits.

Since the decision disqualifying the claimant has been affirmed, the claimant was overpaid \$5,328.00 in PEUC benefits.

PL 116-136 Sec 2107 provides in pertinent part:

PANDEMIC EMERGENCY UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION.

(2) PROVISIONS OF AGREEMENT. —

Any agreement under paragraph (1) shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of pandemic emergency unemployment compensation to individuals who—

- (A) have exhausted all rights to regular compensation under the State law or under Federal law with respect to a benefit year (excluding any benefit year that ended before July 1, 2019).
- (B) have no rights to regular compensation with respect to a week under such law or any other State unemployment compensation law or to compensation under any other Federal law.
- (C) are not receiving compensation with respect to such week under the unemployment compensation law of Canada; and
- (D) are able to work, available to work, and actively seeking work.

. . .

- (e) Fraud and Overpayments
- (2) Repayment. --In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency...

The terms and conditions of the State law which apply to claims for regular compensation and to the payment thereof (including terms and conditions relating to availability for work, active search for work, and refusal to accept work) shall apply to claims for pandemic emergency unemployment compensation and the payment thereof, except where otherwise inconsistent with the provisions of this section or with the regulations or operating instructions of the Secretary promulgated to carry out this section... See PL 116-136 Sec 2107 (4)(B).

Since the decision disqualifying the claimant has been affirmed, this also disqualifies claimant from receiving Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC). The claimant was overpaid \$5,328.00 in Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC).

The claimant may have to repay the benefits received thus far, unless the claimant applies and is approved for PUA, as directed in the paragraph below.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated September 8, 2021, (reference 05), is affirmed. The claimant was overpaid \$5,328.00 in Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC). The claimant must repay those benefits.
