STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed a timely appeal from a decision dated March 12, 2020, reference 07, that denied benefits effective March 1, 2020, for failure to report for reemployment services. After due notice was issued, a hearing was held by telephone conference call before an Administrative Law Judge on April 20, 2020. Claimant did participate.

ISSUES:

Whether claimant failed to report as directed?

Whether claimant is able and available for work?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony and having examined the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant moved from the residence listed with IWD to a different residence and did not change the address with the USPS or with IWD.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant has not established a good cause reason for having failed to report for reemployment services as claimant did not provide a proper address with either the USPS or with IWD. Benefits withheld until such time that claimant does participate in reemployment services.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.2(1)e provides:

e. In order to maintain continuing eligibility for benefits during any continuous period of unemployment, an individual shall report as directed to do so by an authorized representative of the department. If the individual has moved to another locality, the

individual may register and report in person at a workforce development center at the time previously specified for the reporting.

- (1) An individual who files a weekly continued claim will have the benefit payment automatically deposited weekly on a debit card specified by the department.
- (2) The department retains the ultimate authority to choose the method of reporting and payment.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.6(1-6) provides:

Reemployment services and eligibility assessment procedure.

- (1) The department of workforce development will provide a program which consists of profiling claimants and providing reemployment services.
- (1) Purpose.
- a. Profiling is a systematic procedure used to identify claimants who, because of certain characteristics, are determined to be permanently separated and most likely to exhaust benefits. Such claimants may be referred to reemployment services.
- b. The eligibility assessment program is used to accelerate the individual's return to work and systematically review the individual's efforts towards the same goal.
- (3) Reemployment services and eligibility assessment may include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. An assessment of the claimant's aptitude, work history, and interest.
 - b. Employment counseling regarding reemployment approaches and plans.
 - c. Job search assistance and job placement services.
 - d. Labor market information.
 - e. Job search workshops or job clubs and referrals to employers.
 - f. Résumé preparation.
 - g. Other similar services.
- (4) As part of the initial intake procedure, each claimant shall be required to provide the information necessary for profiling and evaluation of the likelihood of needing reemployment assistance.
- (5) The referral of a claimant and the provision of reemployment services is subject to the availability of funding and limitations of the size of the classes.
- (6) A claimant shall participate in reemployment services when referred by the department unless the claimant establishes justifiable cause for failure to participate or

the claimant has previously completed such training or services. Failure by the claimant to participate without justifiable cause shall disqualify the claimant from the receipt of benefits until the claimant participates in the reemployment services or eligibility assessment. The claimant shall contact the agency prior to the scheduled appointment or service to advise the department of the justifiable cause.

a. Justifiable cause for failure to participate is an important and significant reason which a reasonable person would consider adequate justification in view of the paramount importance of reemployment to the claimant. Justifiable cause includes when the claimant is scheduled for an employment interview, is verified return to work, or both prior to the scheduled appointment or service.

b. Reserved.

This rule is intended to implement lowa Code section 96.4(7).

As failure to have a proper address listed with IWD does not constitute good cause for failing to attend reemployment services, claimant's in not eligible for benefits at this time.

Note to Claimant: This decision determines you are not eligible for regular unemployment insurance benefits. If you disagree with this decision you may file an appeal to the Employment Appeal Board by following the instructions on the first page of this decision. Individuals who do not qualify for regular unemployment insurance benefits due to disqualifying separations may qualify for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA). You will need to apply for PUA to determine your eligibility under the program. Additional information on how to apply for PUA can be found at https://www.iowaworkforcedevelopment.gov/pua-information.

DECISION:

The decision of the representative dated March 12, 2020, reference 07, is affirmed. Benefits shall be withheld effective March 1, 2020 until such time that claimant participates in reemployment services.
