

allowed benefits based on Mr. Moses' July 22, 2005 separation from Volt. The employer timely appealed the determination. On September 9, 2005, Workforce Development issued an additional decision, reference 06, which allowed benefits to Mr. Moses based on a July 24, 2005 separation from Volt. The employer also appealed this decision and a hearing was held on October 5, 2005 before an administrative law judge. The October 11, 2005 decision of the administrative law judge denied benefits. The parties agree that Mr. Moses had only one period of employment with Volt and that the employment ended in July of 2004.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

The administrative law judge concludes from all of the evidence that Mr. Moses had only one period of employment and only one separation from Volt. The matter of his July 22, 2005, separation has been adjudicated in an administrative law judge's decision issued on October 11, 2005. The decision reversed the prior allowance of benefits. The decision that is the subject of the appeal herein shall be reversed to be consistent with the October 11, 2005 decision of the administrative law judge.

**DECISION:**

The representative's decision dated August 31, 2005, reference 04, is hereby reversed so as to be consistent with the disqualification issued by an administrative law judge on October 11, 2005. Benefits are withheld until such time as Mr. Moses has worked in and been paid wages for insured work equal to ten times his weekly job insurance benefit amount, provided he satisfies all other conditions of eligibility.
