**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

Benjamin Wolfe, the claimant/appellant, filed an appeal from the March 9, 2021, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision that warned him to make at least two work-search contacts per week but did not deny benefits. Mr. Wolfe was properly notified of the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on May 1, 2021. No hearing was held as there was sufficient information in the appeal letter and administrative record to resolve the matter without testimony. Official notice was taken of the administrative record.

**ISSUE:**

Was the work search warning appropriate?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Mr. Wolfe claimed benefits for the week ending March 6, 2021. Mr. Wolfe made two work searches for that week. Mr. Wolfe forgot to input the number of work searches he did that week.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that Mr. Wolfe has made an active and earnest search for work.

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in

section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(28) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(28) A claimant will be ineligible for benefits because of failure to make an adequate work search after having been previously warned and instructed to expand the search for work effort.

Mr. Wolfe has sufficiently demonstrated to the satisfaction of the administrative law judge an active and earnest search for work for the week ending March 6, 2021. Accordingly, the warning was inappropriate.

**DECISION:**

The March 9, 2021, (reference 01) unemployment insurance decision is reversed. Mr. Wolfe did make an active and earnest search for work for the week ending March 6, 2021. Therefore, the warning was inappropriate.
