STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed an unemployment insurance decision dated March 3, 2014, reference 02, which denied benefits to the claimant. Due notice was issued scheduling the matter for a telephone hearing to be held before Administrative Law Judge Julie Elder April 1, 2014. Before a hearing could be held, the Agency granted the relief requested by the claimant by issuing a subsequent decision holding the March 3, 2014, decision null and void. Under these circumstances, no hearing is necessary.

Because the date of the claimant's separation was incorrect on the reference 02 decision and that issue was corrected in the reference 04 decision, no hearing in this matter was necessary.

ISSUE:

The issue is whether a hearing in this matter is necessary and whether the appeal should be dismissed.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having reviewed and considered all of the evidence in the record, finds that: The decision from which the claimant has appealed has been rendered null and void by a subsequent fact-finding decision issued March 7, 2014.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The question is whether a hearing in this matter is necessary. In this case, the March 3, 2014, decision from which the claimant appealed was later amended and considered null and void by the Department. As a result of the later decision that amended reference 02, there are no issues to be adjudicated in this matter. This matter is therefore dismissed.
