**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

The claimant filed a timely appeal from the October 7, 2014, (reference 02) decision that denied benefits because of a failure to report as directed. After due notice was issued, a telephone conference hearing was set for November 5, 2014. Claimant responded but no hearing was held as there was sufficient evidence in the appeal letter and administrative record to resolve the matter without testimony.

**ISSUE:**

Did the claimant fail to report as directed or offer a good-cause reason for failure to do so?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Having heard the testimony and having examined the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: On September 22, 2014, a notice was mailed to the claimant to report to IWD about his availability for work the week ending September 13, 2014. He did not report because he did not receive the notice. The claimant filed a weekly voice response claim and mistakenly pushed the button indicating he refused work.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the underlying issue was the result of a reporting error, and the claimant has established a good-cause reason for having failed to report as directed.

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in § 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as defined in § 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of § 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under § 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.2(1)e provides:

e. In order to maintain continuing eligibility for benefits during any continuous period of unemployment, an individual shall report as directed to do so by an authorized representative of the department. If the individual has moved to another locality, the individual may register and report in person at a workforce development center at the time previously specified for the reporting.

The method of reporting shall be weekly if a voice response continued claim is filed, unless otherwise directed by an authorized representative of the department. An individual who files a voice response continued claim will have the benefit payment automatically deposited weekly in the individual's financial institution's account or be paid by the mailing of a warrant on a biweekly basis.

In order for an individual to receive payment by direct deposit, the individual must provide the department with the appropriate bank routing code number and a checking or savings account number.

The department retains the ultimate authority to choose the method of reporting and payment.

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(11) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(11) Failure to report as directed to workforce development in response to the notice which was mailed to the claimant will result in the claimant being deemed not to meet the availability requirements.

Since he did not receive the notice and the underlying issue was the result of an error, claimant has established a good-cause reason for failing to report as directed, benefits are allowed.

**DECISION:**

The October 7, 2014, (reference 02) unemployment insurance decision is reversed. The claimant has established a good-cause reason for failing to report as directed. The underlying issue was the result of a reporting error. Benefits are allowed effective September 28, 2014.
