Section 96.3-7 – Recovery of Overpayments

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

James R. Dyer filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated October 28, 2004, reference 04, which ruled that he had been overpaid \$375.00 for the five weeks ending October 23, 2004. After due notice was issued, a telephone hearing was held on November 23, 2004 with Mr. Dyer participating. This matter is considered on a consolidated record with 04A-UI-11790-AT.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony of the witness and having examined all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: James R. Dyer received unemployment insurance benefits in the gross amount of \$375.00 for the five weeks ending October 23, 2004. The fact-finding decision disqualifying him for benefits has been reversed by the administrative law judge's decision in the companion case.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The question is whether Mr. Dyer must repay the \$375.00. He need not do so. Iowa Code section 96.3-7 requires that unemployment insurance benefits be repaid if, and only if, they were paid in error. Since the decision denying benefits to Mr. Dyer has been reversed, the administrative law judge concludes that the benefits were not paid in error and need not be repaid.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated October 28, 2004, reference 04, is reversed. The claimant has not been overpaid.
