### STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

An appeal was filed from a representative's decision dated March 25, 2020, reference 03. A hearing was scheduled for May 4, 2020. Shortly after the hearing began, claimant, through her attorney Bradley Boffeli, requested the appeal be withdrawn.

#### ISSUE:

The issue is whether the appeal should be withdrawn.

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having considered the evidence in the record, finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request has been submitted verbally during the hearing.

### **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of an administrative law judge or the manager or chief administrative law judge of the appeals bureau. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is taperecorded by the presiding officer.

An appeal may be dismissed upon the request of a party or in the agency's discretion when the issue or issues on appeal have been resolved in the appellant's favor.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

No hearing shall be held in this matter.

Note to Claimant: This decision determines you are not eligible for regular unemployment insurance benefits. If you disagree with this decision you may file an appeal to the Employment Appeal Board by following the instructions on the first page of this decision. Individuals who do not qualify for regular unemployment insurance benefits due to disqualifying separations may qualify for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA). You will need to apply for PUA to determine your eligibility under the program. # **DECISION:**

The decision of the representative dated March 25, 2020, reference 03, is affirmed. The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal is approved, and the decision of the representative shall stand and remain in full force and effect. Claimant is not entitled to receive unemployment insurance benefits, until eligibility requirements have been satisfied. The hearing set for May 4, 2020 at 3pm is hereby cancelled.
