Section 96.4-3 – Able and Available/Search for Work

### STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed a department decision dated February 16, 2010, reference 01, that warned him for failing to make a search for work. A telephone hearing was held on April 15, 2010. The claimant participated.

#### ISSUE:

Whether the claimant failed to make and active and earnest search for work.

### FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge having heard the testimony of the witness, and having considered the evidence in the record, finds: When claimant filed his claim effective February 7, 2010, the department coded it #6 that permits him to use résumé as a means of searching for work. During the first week of the claimant's claim ending February 13, the claimant made two employer contacts. The claimant made an inadvertent err of recording only one job search while claiming.

## **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

Iowa Code section 96.4-3 provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

The administrative law judge concludes the claimant made the required job search the week ending February 13, and the department warning is removed from his claim.

# **DECISION:**

The department decision dated February 16, 2010, reference 01, is reversed. The warning is removed.
