Section 96.4-3 – Eligibility for Benefits

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Susan A. Merritt filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated April 22, 2004, reference 07, which denied benefits to her for the two weeks ending April 17, 2004 upon a finding that she was medically unable to work during the two weeks in question. After due notice was issued, a telephone hearing was held May 21, 2004 with Ms. Merritt participating.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having heard the testimony of the witness and having examined all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Susan A. Merritt was ill with walking pneumonia

during the two weeks between April 4 and April 17, 2004. Her physician had advised her not to work.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The question is whether Ms. Merritt is eligible for unemployment insurance benefits for the two weeks in question. She is not.

Iowa Code Section 96.4-3 provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

An individual must be medically able to work in order to qualify for unemployment insurance benefits for any given week. The evidence in this record establishes that Ms. Merritt was not able to work during the two weeks in question because she was ill. Thus, she was not eligible for benefits for that period of time.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated April 22, 2004, reference 07, is affirmed. The claimant is ineligible for unemployment insurance benefits for the two weeks ending April 17, 2004.
